callousness toward his mother's funeral and his murder of the Arab. His lack of remorse, combined with his lack of sadness expressed toward his mother, works against him and earns him the nickname Monsieur Antichrist from the examining magistrate. During the trial itself, Meursault's character witnesses do more harm than good, because they highlight Meursault's apparent apathy and disengagement. Eventually, Meursault is found guilty of murder with malice aforethought and is sentenced to death by guillotine.
